SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Inhalation: Remove affected person to fresh air and keep rested. In case of respiratory arrest, apply artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, a trained person can administer oxygen. Call a POISON CENTRE/doctor if you feel unwell.
